As the introduction to a home, the hall should represent the home's personality as a whole. The entry in this New York duplex was designed for a family with five children, so we wanted it to be formal but also functional. We used beautiful handmade Chinese wallpaper to lend an elegant note and incorporated wainscotting below for sticky fingers and skateboards. In a small room, a large print adds scale and importance, and I love a visual punch upon entering a room: a scenic paper, a high-gloss paint finish or stencilled grasscloth. The Asian wallpaper and pretty garden stools are balanced by the neoclassical console and Regency mirror. Mixing styles like this keeps the space more approachable and less serious.
